from the fees in order to avoid unreasonable burde	ens and to promote public access to such
information.	
The court entered a General Order re Exem	nption From Electronic Access Fees, on
November 8, 1995, that exempted the trustees of the	his district from these fees when accessing
routine information and reports related to carrying	out their duties. The court now finds good
cause to exempt the U.S. Trustee for the Southern	District of Iowa from these fees.
All other provisions of the original order, d	lated November 8, 1999, remain in effect.
This exemption is effective commencing or	n the date of this general order.
